POSITION: Training NCO (68W)

GRADE: SSG/E6 (Also see Area of Consideration)

LOCATION: 1st Battalion, 126th Aviation Regiment, CO C, Fillmore St. Building 345 BIA, Bangor, ME 04401-3027

CLOSING DATE: 04 September 2014

AREA OF CONSIDERATION: Open to **permanently assigned, on board** only Maine Army National Guard AGR Soldiers, in the rank of Staff Sergeant (E6), qualified or eligible to become qualified in MOS 68W. (Also see Eligibility Requirement below).

MILITARY/FULL-TIME ASSIGNMENT: Selected applicant will be assigned militarily as an E6 68W3F, Air Ambulance NCO, (UMR Position 402/07) and full time as an E6 Training NCO (FTMD Position 2050/073) with 1st Battalion, 126th Aviation Regiment, CO C Fillmore St. Building 345 BIA, Bangor, ME 04401-3027

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT: Selected individual **must be, or be eligible to become, 68WF3 Air Ambulance NCO qualified** per DA PAM 611-21, within one year of assignment/reassignment. Selected individual will also be required to complete an NGB prescribed course at Professional Education Center, Little Rock, Arkansas associated with their Full Time Support position within the first year of employment, but preferable within six months of their hire. This is a condition of continued employment.

Current AGR Soldiers wishing to apply must have the concurrence of their chain of command, and have served at least 18 months in their current assignment unless TAG has waived this requirement.

LENGTH OF TOUR: AGR's will continue on the current AGR tour orders they are currently on but will be reassigned if necessary to 1st Battalion, 126th Aviation Regiment, CO C Fillmore St. Building 345 BIA, Bangor, ME 04401-3027. No AGR will exceed their retention control point.

JOB DESCRIPTION: See Special Duties and Requirements at end of Job announcement

HOW TO APPLY: MEARNG AGR applicants will submit a memorandum of interest through their Chain of Command with a courtesy copy sent to HRO-AGR. - Memorandums must reach the HRO-AGR office NOT LATER THAN THE CLOSING DATE. 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SPECIAL DUTIES AND REQUIREMENTS-

Duties:

**10-68W. MOS 68W Health Care Specialist (Health Care Sp) CMF 68
(Army Civilian Acquired Skills Program (ACASP) designated MOS)**

a. *Major duties.* The health care specialist provides emergency medical treatment, limited primary care, force health protection, evacuation in a variety of operational and clinical settings from point of injury or illness through the continuum of military health care and, as a field combat medic, provides emergency medical care/treatment at point of wounding on the battlefield or to battle and non-battle casualties during wartime.

(1) *MOSC 68W10.* Administer emergency medical treatment to battlefield casualties, assists with outpatient care and treatment or assists with inpatient care and treatment under the supervision of a physician, nurse, physician's assistant or a health care NCO.

(2) *MOSC 68W20.* Administers emergency and routine medical treatment to battle and non-battle casualties, assists with outpatient care and treatment and supervises field and clinical medical facilities under the supervision of a physician, nurse, or physician's assistant.

(3) *MOSC 68W30.* Supervise activities of field, clinical and mobile treatment facilities.

b. *Physical demands rating and qualifications for initial award of MOS.* Qualifications in subparagraphs (7), (8), (9) and (10) below are required for retention of MOS. The health care specialist or combat medic must possess the following qualifications:

(1) A physical demands rating of moderately heavy.

(2) A physical profile of 111121.

(3) No aversion to blood.

(4) No history of alcoholism, drug addiction, indiscriminate use of habit-forming or dangerous drugs.

(5) Must maintain a current, valid, unrestricted National Registry Emergency Medical Technician – Basic Certification to retain MOS 68W

(6) No history of a felony conviction.

(7) No history of conviction of crimes involving:

(a) An out of hospital patient or a patient or resident of a medical care facility.

(b) Financial exploitation of a person entrusted to a care of the applicant.

(c) Any weapons/ammunition/explosives/arson charges.

(d) Any drug activity involving illegal possession, buying, selling, or distribution (dealing) of controlled substances or synthetics.

(e) Violence against persons, animals or property.

(f) Sexual misconduct.

(8) No record of conviction by special or general courts-martial or civilian courts of offenses listed in AR 27-10 (Military Justice) chapter 24 or otherwise required to register as a sexual offender under AR 27-10, chapter 24.

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(9) Formal training (completion of MOS 68W course conducted under auspices of Army Medical Department Center and School) mandatory; or completion of the Exportable 68W1O Course conducted by reserve component (RC) unit approved by the AMEDDC&S; or meet the ACASP criteria per paragraph 9-5b(5)(b) of this pamphlet and below in paragraph (a) for health care specialist MOSC 68W1O as outlined below.

(a) Health Care Specialist (MOSC 68W1O): Soldiers will be accelerated to the Army specific portion of the course (Limited Primary Care) if they hold: (1) One of the following certifications with the National Registry Emergency Medical Technician (NREMT); EMT, EMT-Advanced, or Paramedic. (2) Current American Heart Association (AHA) certification for Basic Life Support (BLS) for Healthcare Providers with at least 12 months remaining from the start of the course. Depending on determination of their certification expiration date/s, Soldiers will be accelerated to the next available class beginning in the Limited Primary Care Module. State EMT certification will allow the individual to challenge the National Certification Exam (NREMT). (3) The Emergency Medical Services (Army EMS) Medical Director or his designee will verify certification through the National Registry or State Licensing department.

(b) Nationally Registered Flight Paramedic (MOSC 68WxxF3): Possess a current certification as a Nationally Registered Paramedic.

1. Must complete 68W training under the auspices of the AMEDDC&S and be awarded MOS 68W prior to being assigned as a MOSC 68WxxF3.

2. Must possess a current and qualified Class 3 Flight Physical Examination.

3. Must complete Phase One 300-F6 ASI F3 producing course.

4. Must complete Phase Three Critical Care Clinical Skills Course.

c. *Additional skill identifiers: (Note: Refer to table 12-8 (Listing of universal ASI's associated with all enlisted MOS)).*

(2) F3--Aero-Medical Evacuation (Rotary Wing).

521st TRP CMD CERFP Requirements

The Selected individual will be required to participate in an extremely rigorous training program. This training will occur in various school environments, both military and civilian, throughout the country. This duty position will require at least 90 hours of technical training above and beyond any professional development schools. The online Incident Command courses 100, 200, 700, 800 and hazardous material awareness level certification must be completed within 30 days of the AGR order start date. Due to the physical demands of the CERFP mission, the selected individual must meet the medical standards in chapter 9, NGR 500-4 before starting on AGR orders. These eligibility requirements are a condition of continued employment.

NGR 500-4, Chapter 9, para 2.a.:

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- a.** Given the physical demands of the NG CERFP mission, special consideration will be given to the physical conditioning readiness. Personnel with a history of physical profile capacity of P-3 or higher IAW 40-501, Standards of Medical Fitness or AFI 48-123, Medical Examinations and Standards should be excluded from consideration for NG CERFP assignments. The ability to don and function in PPE is a requirement for all NG CERFP members. Unit personnel will be screened IAW 29 CFR 1910.120 and all personnel will be required to complete the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) Respirator Medical Evaluation Questionnaire annually (29 CFR 1910.133 App C). Personnel who do not meet the minimum physical requirements or have medical/psychological conditions that would preclude service on the NG CERFP will not be assigned, waivers will not be granted.
