Since October 2004, the Maine Military Funeral Honor Program has performed 3111 Military Funerals for the Veterans of Maine. According to the Maine Veteran's Administration, Maine will lose nearly 4000 Veterans (all branches) per year through the year 2010. Retirees are welcome to participate in providing Military Funeral Honors for Maine's Veterans. The rendering of Military Funeral Honors is a way to show our Nation's deep gratitude to those who, in times of war and peace, have faithfully defended our country. Funds are available to compensate certain categories of retirees and buglers.

When requested, Retirees, in class A uniform will receive a per day stipend, (whether training or performing a Military Funeral. This stipend is intended to offset the cost of gasoline, meal and other authorized expenses. To perform Military Funerals you will need to train with the current members of the team. This would be a 4 hour, hands on session. I will not put you on the spot. You will not be asked to present a flag to the next of kin until you are comfortable. If you have any questions please contact me at the above numbers or stop by my office here at the Augusta Armory.

Only persons to receive a stipend are those requested to be party of the funeral party by Mr. Norwood and are qualified.

"People can say, 'You should have done this. You should have done that,'" said 1st Lt. Tamara A. Da Silva, the convoy commander. "At the end of the day, when it's all said and done, all our soldiers are alive."

The battle began after roadside bombs exploded and struck three vehicles in the convoy. Small-arms fire and rocket-propelled grenades then rained down on the troops. As vehicles became disabled and soldiers were wounded, a medical evacuation helicopter was called.

When it became disabled by enemy fire, more helicopters from Kandahar Air Field deployed. Some of the aircraft circled above the fray to help target enemy fighters.

"You could look up into the sky and see Kiowa pilots in their [physical-training uniforms] and their helmets," said Pfc. Jeffrey Wiedel, who was injured and received the Purple Heart.

Da Silva said the insurgents had done their homework.

"The enemy knew our [tactics, techniques and procedures]," she said. "They knew what we were going to do."

Eventually, a U.S. Navy F-18 Hornet dropped a couple 500-pound bombs on the mountainside where the enemy was located, bringing to a close one of the longest sustained fights since 2003.

The enemy fired about 14 rocket-propelled grenades and detonated multiple roadside bombs during the battle. They used armor-piercing rounds, machine guns and assault rifles, firing from nearby homes, the tree line or dug-in positions.

Delivering fuel is still the primary mission of the Maine Army National Guard soldiers, but they realize they are combat troops every day.

"The way the war is going in Afghanistan," said Cpl. Robert W. Lewis, "at any time, you have to be a 360-degree soldier."

Dangerous Hours: Ambush Leads to Sustained Battle

Soldiers from the 286th Combat Support Sustainment Battalion battled insurgents in Afghanistan for nine hours following an ambush in late July.

Some soldiers said the insurgents were so close it was possible to see their faces.

We in the United States have all heard the haunting song, "Taps."
It's the song that gives us that lump in our throats and usually tears
in our eyes.

But, do you know the story behind the song? If not, I think you will be
interested to find out about its humble beginnings.

toward his encampment. When the Captain finally reached his own lines,
he discovered it was actually a Confederate soldier, but the soldier was
dead. The Captain lit a lantern and suddenly caught his breath and
went numb

with shock. In the dim light, he saw the face of the soldier. It was
his own
son.

The boy had been studying music in the South when the war broke out.
Without telling his father, the boy enlisted in the Confederate Army.

The following morning, heartbroken, the father asked permission of his
superiors to give his son a full military burial, despite his enemy
status.

His request was only partially granted. The Captain had asked if he
could have a group of Army band members play a funeral dirge for his
son at

the funeral. The request was turned down since the soldier was a
Confederate.

But, out of respect for the father, they did say they could give him
only one musician.

The Captain chose a bugler. He asked the bugler to play a series of
musical notes he had found on a piece of paper in the pocket of the
dead youth's
uniform. This wish was granted.

The haunting melody, we now know as "Taps" used at military
funerals was born.

The words are:

Day is done ... Gone the sun ... From the lakes
From the hills ... >From the sky All is well ...
Safely rest... God is nigh ...

Fading light ... Dims the sight And a star ...
Gems the sky... Gleaming bright ... From afar ...
Drawing nigh ... Falls the night ...

Thanks and praise For our days Neath the sun
Neath the stars Neath the sky ... As we go ...
This we know ... God is nigh...

"Subject: Army Retroactive Stop-loss Pay Announcement

In accordance with HR 2346 War Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2009, Public Law 111-32, Section 310, the Army has announced retroactive Stop Loss special pay for select Soldiers whose Active Duty military service was involuntarily extended between 11 September 2001 and 30 September 2009. If you served involuntarily during this time period you may be eligible for compensation. To submit a claim, go to <https://www.stoplosspay.army.mil>. If you prefer to submit a hardcopy request you can download the application on this website and mail it to the US Army Stop Loss Program Office.

Applications will require the following documents:

Enlisted Soldiers:

- 1) DD Form 214 (Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty)
- 2) DD Form 4 (Enlistment/Reenlistment/Extension Contract)
- 3) DD Form 1966 (Separation Document)
- 4) DA Form 4187 for Stop Loss Adjustment of ETS
- 5) Separation Document NGB 22

Officers:

- 1) DD Form 214 (Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty)
- 2) Memorandum showing approved retirement was denied or suspended.

If you do not have these records and are currently still serving in the Maine Army National Guard, contact your unit personnel NCO for assistance. If you are a retired Maine Guard Soldier, contact CW2 Andrew Cook at 207 430-5000 for out-of-service record support.

The deadline for application submission is 21 October 2010."

5. DD-214 Now available on line

The National Personnel Records Center (NPRC) has provided the following website for veterans to gain access to their DD-214s

online: <http://vetrecs.archives.gov/>

This may be particularly helpful when a veteran needs a copy of his DD-214 for employment purposes. NPRC is working to make it easier for veterans with computers and Internet access to obtain copies of documents from their military files.

Military veterans and the next of kin of deceased former military members may now use a new online military personnel records system to request documents.

Other individuals with a need for documents must still complete the Standard Form 180, which can be downloaded from the online web site. Because the requester will be asked to supply all information essential for NPRC to process the request, delays that normally occur when NPRC has to ask veterans for additional information will be minimized. The new web-based application was designed to provide better service on these requests by eliminating the records centers mailroom and processing time.


