Lodging:

The Senator Inn I highly recommend and is currently with in the per diem rate. All the others are also with in range and respectable lodging. Portland (PWM) is the nearest large airport and Augusta, has a smaller hopper airport.

Travel:

Traveling from the south take RT. 95 Maine Turnpike North (toll road) to Portland. Stay on Rt. 95. or take Rt. 295 as both will converge in Gardiner 15 miles south of Augusta. Rt. 295 will save 15 minutes travel time and cost less. From RT. 95 take Exit 109 to Western Ave. Travel East on Western Ave. for approximately one mile. The Augusta Armory is on your left. Turn left at the traffic light by the armory and travel up the hill on Airport Road. Camp Keyes is located on your right. Follow the street pass the airport on you left side and keep right. The main entrance is located on the left approximately 100 yards. I will have a class roster with the security guards. 100% identification is required.

Camp Keyes:

We are located on the top of the hill by the airport. April is rain season and the temperature are 30-60 degrees. Camp Keyes is frequently very windy. There is a small café for noon lunches and there are many area fast food and good restaurants in the immediate area. There are running trails and a gym open 24/7 at Camp Keyes. I also high recommend visiting the Maine Military Museum.

The University of Maine at Augusta maintains hiking and running trails for all levels and the Greenway in Augusta is a shorter pleasant river walk.
