Anti-terrorism Officer (Basic) Course 9E-F5/950-F4 School Code 191 5-9 April 2010 (40 hour Course) if out of state or beyond commuting distance add 4th April for travel.

- 240th RTI, Camp Keyes, Augusta, Maine- report to Bldg 17 NLT 0700
- ATRRS applications should be loaded immediately as this is a nation wide course
- Class size, optimum 36, Max 40
- Multi-state course for Battalion/BDE ATO's and alternates- also directorates dealing with Anti Terrorism/Force Protection issues should have ATO qualified employees (Civil service can attend).
- Should be appointed on orders as ATO or alternate. Course is for E-6 and above, E-5 with proponent waiver.
- **Quarters for instate soldiers are available** at the RTI, POC SFC Hatch 626-4219
- **Mess is not available**
- Out of state students- billeting is not available. Recommend the "Senator- Best Western" which has limited government rate rooms within per diem. Confirm status when making your reservation.
- Airport- while Augusta Regional Airport has service there are limited numbers of flights available. The Region is walking distance to Camp Keyes, but not the hotels and restaurants. Portland Int. Airport (PWM) is Maine's busiest airport. Located 56 miles south of Augusta approx. 1 hour.
- Recommend a rental car. Movement North from Portland to Augusta along the 95(toll) or 395 corridors is similar. Watch for deer, especially in the fall, and black ice from October to April. Both roads merge south of Augusta. Exit 109A will place you on Western Avenue moving to the Kennebec River. The Best Western is located on your immediate right. Further along the road on the left is the Augusta Armory and the left turn after the armory will take your up the hill to the Airport (Left) and Camp Keyes (right). After entering the compound, proceed through the large steel roofed buildings to the RTI , a group of smaller white wooden buildings (overlooking Western Ave).
- **NOTE: The course will be presented by Antiterrorism Branch**
- **Force Protection Training Division**
- **US Army Military Police School to Officers and NCOs', DoD Leadership Employees.**
- **This both OEF and OIF Sourced Battalions/Brigades/Groups are required to have school trained Anti-terrorism Officers prior to deployment. Credit for attending this school is valid for three years.**
- **Primary training will take place at Heywood North with breakout sessions in Heywood South, Webster Hall and building 209 MEANG(2nd floor-secure conference room).**
